Independent Resurvey of Exterior Boundaries,
Menominee Indian Reservation, Wisconsin.

As the present reservation for the Menominee Indians in Wisconsin embraces lands which were reserved and set apart for them by the Treaty of May 12, 1854 (10 Stat. 1065), the boundaries of the reservation must conform to the lines of the public land surveys and may be described as follows: The third standard parallel, North, 14, 15 and 16 E., the range line through Rs. 13, 14, 15 and 16 E., the range line between Tps. 29 and 30 N., between Rs. 12 and 13 E., the township line between Tps. 28 and 29 N., through Rs. 13 and 14 E.; the range line between Tps. 28 N., 29 and 30 N., through Rs. 15 and 16 E.; the township line between Tps. 27 and 28 N., through Rs. 15 and 16 E.; the range line through Tps. 28, 29 and 30 N., between Rs. 16 and 17 E.; the following field notes are those of a dependent resurvey or reestablishment of all the boundaries of the reservation.

The township boundaries making up the boundaries of the reservation were surveyed, and in part resurveyed, by U. S. deputy surveyors, from 1839 to 1890, as shown in the following field notes:

A complete restoration of the original boundaries in the true original positions as adjusted to the identified evidence.

Before reconstructing or restoring the corners, the lines of the original surveys were retraced and search was made for the evidence of the original corner posts and bearing trees, and other calls of the field notes. When duly identified or restored, the corner positions were remonumented and new bearing trees marked. After completing the retracements, the true lines were duly run and marked through the timber.

The rules of proportionate measurement were applied in order to ascertain the position of each lost or obliterated corner, after completing the necessary retracements, to connect with the identified corner locations, but not until exhausting every reasonable possibility of obtaining direct evidence for the control of each particular corner.

In order to simplify the record, the true line notes only are supplied here, which refer to the completed resurvey.

The Survey commenced September 18, 1922, and executed with light mountain solar transits made by Buff and Buff, Serial Nos. 9935, 14187, 16728, 17997, and 19424, all constructed in accordance with the standard specifications of the General Land Office. The horizontal circles have a diameter of 4 1/2 ins., with two double opposite verniers reading to single minutes; the vertical circles have a diameter of 4 1/2 ins., with one double vernier reading to single minutes; the telescopes have fixed stadia wires, ratio 1:132, with a focal constant of 14 lks. The instruments are equipped with the improved Smith solar attachments, radius of latitude arc 3 ins., and of declination arc 3 1/2 ins., each with verniers reading to single minutes. All instrumental adjustments were examined before the field tests hereinafter recorded were made.

The directions of the random and true lines were determined in part by the solar transit method and in part by the transit angle method. Where the
